The Peachtree Charter Middle School Track Needs Your Help

O onations are being accepted to rebuild the Peachtree Charter Middle School track. During construction of the 6th/7th grade building, construction equipment was housed on the track causing the track to deteriorate.

The current track is not only an eye sore, but is responsible for multiple injuries throughout the year. Presently, children use the broken asphalt track on a daily basis for PE and track practice. Every elementary school feeds to PCMS, and every current elementary student will get to use a new, safe track if we act today and raise the money needed to rebuild. Members of the DNCA board teamed together and personally made a \$100 donation to the PCMS Track fund. PCMS must raise \$80,000 in total, and are hoping to raise \$20,000 for the 2011-2012 year. hesnut Charter Elementary School has greatly expanded their paper recycling. They have added cans and plastics numbered 1 through 7 to the mix and the students are excited. Asked for a quote here is what two students said," If we don't recycle, the water we drink may not be clean" said Dania."



Recycling is important to me to keep the world clean." said Dean Eith, another student on the 'recycle team'


One obstacle Chesnut and other Dunwoody schools have had in involving students in a recycling program is the big, green recycling dumpster. It's too tall even for an adult to easily reach to empty a box of recyclables. For children; impossible without hazard.

In response to the challenge, the Dunwoody Sustainability Commission Recycling Committee did some research and identified a recycling company that does not use a dumpster. Instead, the Go Green Company, LLC, brings 95 gallon roller carts to location. These carts can be filled with recyclables and visited every week by Go Green trucks. Go Green empties the carts' contents into their truck and return the "empties' to begin the process all over again. An extra bonus is that the school receives a small rebate based on the amount of materials recycled so Chesnut School is now using Go Green!

Under the leadership of Principal, Dr. Reid, Interim Principal Ms. Heckman, PTA President, Michelle Quintans and teacher recycling sponsor Timika Howard, the program is up and running in this new school year.

Each classroom and office now has a recycling container. Designated students do a scheduled pick up of the boxes and empty them into the roll carts.

Chesnut parent, Andrew Hirst who has taken on most of the job of school recycling in past school years says, "It does my heart good to see the program so greatly expanded and to have all of the school involved. I am rewarded."

Audrey Jane (Frazier) Osborn March 4, 1922 to June 30, 2011

udrey Osborn moved to Dunwoody North subdivision with her husband Al and son Neal in 1971.

Audrey's many talents gleaned as a military wife gave her many skills. Dunwoody North was fertile ground for those skills. She was active in the formation of Dunwoody North Civic Association; responsible for typing the first newsletters and directories on a 1940's vintage Royal typewriter.

Audrey also was instrumental in the Dunwoody North Home & Garden Club and held various offices in each organization.

If Audrey saw a need for something that would make someone more comfortable she was always the first to volunteer. Her son Neal said, "Mother was a community organizer before that was a common term."

She was also a one woman welcoming committee. The 18 wheel moving van was still in front of my house when she rang my door bell, presented me with a warm loaf of bread, and invited me to the next Garden Club meeting.

Extending this hospitality outside of our neighborhood, the Osborns' love of travel prompted their involvement in the formation of the Atlanta Chapter of the International Friendship Force.

There was nothing common about Audrey Jane Osborn. She has left big shoes to be filled in Dunwoody North and is missed.
