The Dunwoody North Civic Association (DNCA) has as its' mission to represent the Dunwoody North Communities in county and state issues concerning the neighborhoods. The DNCA also assists the residents of the Dunwoody North Communities to protect and enhance the value of their property.

The Dunwoody North Communities are comprised of approximately 1,000 homes. The area encompasses North Peachtree Road, The Dunwoody side of Peachtree Industrial and both sides of Tilly Mill Road. All resident of the Dunwoody North Communities are invited to join and participate in the Civic Association.

DNCA collects dues each year in January. The DNCA hosts three or four meetings throughout the year, as well as meetings called to discus new zonings or other timely issues affecting the neighborhood. You will receive newsletter 10 days prior to any meetings and notices at street corners prior to called meetings.

The DNCA has built a strong relationship over the years with city, county and state government. That relationship has been instrumental in gathering support to fight detrimental development and secure development that enhances the area. DNCA also has a reciprocal relationship with nearby homeowner groups to assist and support each other.


