COMMUNITY LIAISONS

BROOKRUN: Thally Mattox is your Dunwoody North representative for Brookrun. She recently attended a preliminary meeting at Brookrun concerning a proposal of placing a mini police precinct that would support the main precinct on Ashford Dunwoody, along with Nick Nicodemus who is the DHA representative for Brookrun and also a Dunwoody North Resident. The Dunwoody Preservation Trust and Dekalb County are in the final stages in finding a firm to help develop the Master Plan for the property. Look for articles in the Dunwoody Crier for updates.

PEACHTREE DEKALB AIRPORT: David Fowler, DNCA immediate past president has been appointed to the Airport Authority Board and will attend the monthly meetings. He has already learned that it is important for you to personally call the noise abatement office at 770-936-5442 concerning low flying planes or those violating the voluntary curfew. Please leave a message concerning the noise and be sure to include your neighborhood as Dunwoody North, your street address and name if possible. After your phone call to PDK, you may email David at davidfowler@dunwoodynorth.org with the date and time you called and he will verify that your complaint was registered on PDK's monthly noise report. If David is able to prove that our neighborhoods noise complaints are not being registered he will then raise the issue.

DUNWOODY HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION: DHA is our biggest ally when we need the "Big Guns" and as one of the largest communities in Dunwoody, the DNCA is represented on the Board of the Dunwoody Homeowners Association.
